# Water Bill information BULLETIN

Enclosed is your water bill for the months of January and February 2022. If your water bill indicates a balance forward, it's important to note that interest has been calculated to the current billing date. Interest will be applied at 1.25% on the first day of each month thereafter. For your convenience, your water bill can be paid in the comfort of your home through online banking.

Please contact the Water Clerk at (705) 429-3844 ext. 2245 if you experience any of the following:

- If the property was **occupied** during this billing cycle but both the **Previous and Current Read are the same.**
- If the current bill reflects 'Flat Rate Residential' water/sewer rates.



## E-RECEIPTS AND BILLING

## Mayor's Message

Our latest edition of the Information Bulletin contains some great content for your review.

This includes an item about Statistics Canada's 2021 census data, which confirms Wasaga Beach is a desirable place for people to live. In fact, we are one of the fastest growing communities in the country.

Our population now sits at 24,862 as of 2021 – that's almost 7,500 more people than a decade ago. These numbers are reflective of the record-breaking building activity happening in our town. I talk to new residents all the time and there is a theme to why they have settled in Wasaga Beach: quality of life, affordability, our beautiful waterfront and trails, access to schools, good health care, and our proximity to area communities. Did you know that in 2015 we invested approximately

to be open in September 2023, and confirmed that the board is hoping to have a high school open in Wasaga Beach for the 2029-2030 school year.

## 2022 election information page now available

The Town of Wasaga Beach's 2022 municipal election webpage is now active.

"The page is a one-stop location for people to access information about the municipal election," said Dina Lundy, director of legislative services and returning officer for the Town of Wasaga Beach. "We encourage everyone to visit the page, and subscribe to receive further updates as the year progresses. If anyone has questions, we are here to help."

The municipal election is Oct. 24. Voters will have the opportunity to cast a ballot in-person or online for the following offices:

- Mayor
- Deputy mayor
- Five councillor positions
- School board trustee

The town's election webpage currently contains information on the following subjects:

- Key dates
- Election methods
- Elected positions
- Voter requirements and information
- Candidate and campaign requirements

As well, the page includes a link to the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation's website [www.voterlookup.ca](http://www.voterlookup.ca), where people can confirm or update their electoral information, add an elector name to an address, and change their school board support.

## Twin-pad arena and library construction continues

Building work on the twin-pad arena and library project at 544 River Rd. W. continues.

Steel for the frame of the building recently arrived on site.

The project remains on time and on budget.

Fundraising for the project continues as well.

Recently, the Anstey family donated \$10,000 to the project.

The donation is in memory of Doug Anstey, one of the original partners who built the Wasaga Stars Arena in the early 1970s. Privately constructed, the town purchased the facility in 1977.

In recognition of the family's donation to the new arena and library, the town will name a change room for Anstey, a well-known local plumber and realtor, and former town councillor from 1981 to 1985, who passed away in 2006.

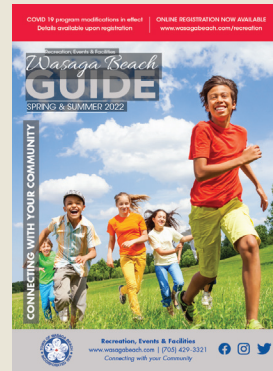
"The construction of the current arena in the 1970s allowed Doug's kids and grandkids to participate in minor hockey and figure skating in our own local arena. We look forward to Doug's great-grandchildren having the same opportunity in the new twin-pad arena in our growing town," the family said in a statement. "We've kept Doug's memory alive through Wasaga Beach Minor Hockey with the 'Doug Anstey Most Dedicated Player Award' and we are pleased to make this donation in his name as we know he would be honoured to be a part of the next generation of skating in Wasaga Beach."

## Water conservation rebates are available!

The Town of Wasaga Beach has a water conservation rebate program.

When you install a low flow or dual flush toilet you are eligible for a \$70 rebate.

Residents who install a rain barrel can get a \$30 rebate.

Please note that only property owners on municipal water are eligible for the rebate. You can find rebate forms at [www.wasagabeach.com](http://www.wasagabeach.com) or pick one up at town hall at 30 Lewis St.

Applicants must include copies of receipts indicating that they purchased the particular item. Completed forms and supporting documentation can be presented at town hall.

The rebate will be applied to your next water bill.

## Census shows Wasaga Beach one of Canada's fastest growing communities

Newly released census data from Statistics Canada shows Wasaga Beach is one of the fastest growing communities in the country.

"We are not really surprised as we have had steady growth over the last few years," Mayor Nina Bifulchi said. "We believe people want to live here because we are an affordable and safe place to live."

In addition, Bifulchi said a number of other factors contribute to making the community a desirable place.

"We have a growing number of housing choices, great schools and good access to health care, a public transit system, a beautiful waterfront, hiking trails, recreation facilities, good water and sewer infrastructure, we are close to larger urban centres and our overall cost of living, including property taxes and water rates, is low," she said.

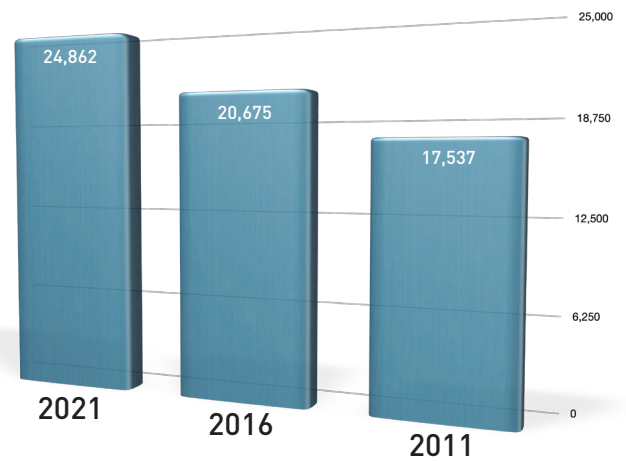

"We look forward to further releases of census data in the months ahead as this will help paint an even more detailed picture of our community," Bifulchi said.

## Convenience credit card payments

Through the town's website using Plastiq (third party), you can pay your property tax and/or water/wastewater bill by Visa, Mastercard, or American Express.

There will be a service fee of 2.5 percent applied by the servicer provider, Plastiq.
