INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Clerk of the Town of Wasaga Beach

We have audited the accompanying financial statements – Auditor's Report Form 4 ("Financial Statements") of **Leslie Farkas** ("candidate"), which comprises the Statement of Campaign Income and Expenses and the Statement of Calculation of Surplus or Deficit for the period from May 10, 2022 to December 31, 2022. The Financial Statements have been prepared by the candidate based on the financial reporting provisions of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

Candidate's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The candidate is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the Financial Statements in accordance with Municipal Elections Act, 1996 and for such internal control as the candidate determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on this Financial Statement based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 and Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the Financial Statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgement, including the assessment of risks of material misstatement of the Financial Statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the candidate's preparation and fair presentation of the Financial Statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by candidate, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the Financial Statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Due to the nature of the types of transactions inherent in the election campaign, the completeness of contributions of goods and services and receipts and disbursements is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these transactions was limited to the amounts recorded in the accounting records of the candidate and we were unable to determine whether any adjustments for unrecorded transactions might be necessary to adjust campaign income and expenses and surplus or deficit.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effect of adjustments described in the Basis of Qualified Opinion paragraph, the Financial Statements of the candidate for the period from May 10, 2022 to December 31, 2022 are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

Other Matter

The Municipal Elections Act, 1996 does not require us to report, nor was it practicable for us to determine, that contributions reported include only those which may be properly retained in accordance with the provision of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Distribution and Use

The Financial Statements are prepared to assist the candidate to meet the Financial Reporting provisions of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996. As a result, the Financial Statements may not be suitable for another purpose. Our report is intended solely for the candidate and the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and should not be distributed to, or used by parties other than the candidate and Ministry of Municipal Affairs.
