BY-LAW 82-13 (consolidated Feb 17, 2003)

## A BY-LAW TO CONTROL LITTERING WITHIN THE TOWN OF WASAGA BEACH

**WHEREAS** Section 210 (76) of The Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 302 provides that by-laws may be passed in the interests of health, sanitation and safety of the inhabitants of the municipality;

**AND WHEREAS** it is deemed desirable and expedient to pass a by-law to control the littering of garbage, refuse and debris;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Wasaga Beach enacts as follows:

## 1. Definitions:

- (a) **GARBAGE** shall mean all vegetable and animal matter subject to decay, whether it be household, commercial or industrial waste and shall include the wrappings in which the same is placed;
- (b) **REFUSE** shall mean all waste material such as, but not limited to, crockery, glass, bones, metal, rags, discarded wearing apparel, discarded furniture and appliances, and all such other kinds of discarded items subject to decay;
- (c) **DEBRIS** shall mean all waste material such as discarded and demolished building material, tree branches, limbs, leaves, grass cuttings and any other like waste material.
- 2. Not withstanding the conditions of By-Law 80-26 of the Town of Wasaga Beach, known as a By-Law to Regulate the Collection of Garbage, no person shall throw, place or deposit by any means any garbage, refuse or debris on any private property or on property of the Municipality of the Town of Wasaga Beach or any local board thereof, without the authority and consent of the owner or occupant of such property.
- 3. Every person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction, shall be liable to a fine of not more than Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, exclusive of costs, as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P33, as amended.
