
- Updated the Establishing and Regulating Bylaw






TRENDS

Between 2010 and 2023 the population of Wasaga Beach has increased by over 8,000 permanent residents.

The call volume for the fire department has more then doubled in the same period.

2010 = 17,000 population, 878 calls

2023 = 25,000+ population, 2,104 calls
